### Local Policing Priorities for the reporting period (in no order of priority)

The Neighbourhood Policing Teams scan the reported incidents, crimes, and intelligence to focus on what is important to their communities. We utilise the Problem Analysis Triangle to inform our approach. We work to break down who are victims, suspects and where the offences are occurring. This informs our deployment into the right areas on an evidence base of data.

### We will engage with our communities by holding face-to-face events

- The team will commit to at least one face-to-face Public Engagement per month.
- We will update our Web Pages every 3 months, with our current priorities.
- We will advertise our public engagements on our website, including the time, date, and location, and on our social media platforms.
- We will ensure our seldom heard groups are heard and engaged with when appropriate.

### We will develop and increase the effectiveness of our digital engagement

- We will continue to engage with our communities through online platforms when necessary. This could include Teams/Zoom meetings.
- PCSOs will post at least once a week on our social media platforms.

### We will improve and increase our use of social media to engage with the public and keep them informed

- We will advertise our public engagements on our social media channels.
- We will use social media to update our communities on our priorities, local issues, good working, advice and what we are doing locally.

### We will consult and engage with our communities to make them integral to the decisions we make

- Poole Neighbourhood Policing Team will continue to engage with our communities and complete 'Public Priority Surveys'. These surveys help to inform our decisions on our Local Policing Priorities
- We will meet monthly with local partners around areas such as Mental Health.
- The Inspector chairs a monthly ASB Intelligence Meeting to formulate the priority victims, suspects, and locations.
- The Inspector chairs a bi-monthly Councillors meeting to discuss community concerns.
- We engage with partner agencies at regular meetings to work together to solve and address issues within our communities.
- The team will continue to attend other partnership working meetings.
- We will consult with our town/parish councils on a regular basis, every quarter, as a minimum.

### We will increase and broaden our engagement across all communities ensuring we are inclusive of seldom-heard communities

- We continue to gather KCCs (Key Community Contacts) who represent the diversity within our communities, can speak for their communities and help us improve the service we provide.
- We will continue to consult with our KCCs and will engage with our seldom heard groups when possible.
